Since arriving at USF, he has overseen the construction of the Geschke Center, which opened in the fall of 1997, numerous

renovations to the now Gleeson-Geschke library and is currently leading the charge to develop learning commons within the Gleeson-Geschke library. He served as president of the Association of College and Research Libraries 2003-04, which is the largest division of the American Library Association. He currently serves on the Friends of the San Francisco Public Library Board and on the Marin County Board of Library Commissioners. Dr. Cannon was born and raised in Hartford, CT, and he is proudly a first generation college student.

Dr. Cannon has truly been a visionary as he along with Associate Dean, Shawn Calhoun has strategized different ways to support the Black Achievement Success and Engagement program and specifically the Black Resource Center.
