Background:

-Apple Tree Dental (ATD) has collaborated with Peninsula Health Care District (PHCD) to address the needs of the community:

-Based on the 2013 San Mateo County Health Needs Assessment, it was found that the prevalence of community members without dental coverage had increased significantly since the 1998 survey. 32.4 % (representing more than 185,000 county adults) lack dental insurance.

-The microsystem is a long term facility that has 34 acute psychiatric, 100 general acute care and 94 skilled nursing beds.

OBJECTIVES:

Global Aim: Reduce infections and further deterioration of oral health care of the frail and elderly. We expect to improve oral assessments, reduce hospital admissions and improve the patients overall health.

Specific Aim: We aim to improve dental care of residents at a San Mateo County Nursing home facility by 100% by May 2015.

METHODS:

Integrating nursing care in oral assessment Modifying the CAMBRA assessment tool Educating the staff

Timeline:

The project timeline began in January 2015 and goes through May 2015. Phase 2 will continue after the completion of project.

2013- 2016	Apple Tree Dental Group and the Peninsula Health Care District Board propose and implement a Center for Dental Health on the PHCD's campus that includes a building, staff and the development of processes to improve the dental care of residents of nursing home facilities in the San Mateo County.

February 2015	Determined the microsystem on focus to be the mobile dental health clin in a nursing home in San Mateo County

April 2015	Developed and presented a modified dental assessment tool gears toward nursing to the team.

OUTCOMES:

*The activities indicated in the timeline may have been delayed.

* Meetings were held by the CNL student, ATD director and Registered Dental Hygienist (RDH) and the PHCD CEO/preceptor.

*The assessment tool was approved by PHCD and ATD. It was evaluated by 2 nurse champions and modifications were made.

* The implementation of the tool has not been initiated in the nursing home due to the fact that the nursing facility has not signed the contract with ATD.

*ATD opened their center and there were 8 staff members attended the short educational session about improving dental care for the elderly in nursing home facilities.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

To improve the dental care of the elderly in the nursing home, the CNL will:

- -Encourage the utilization of the assessment tool with every admission.
- Continued education of the staff and patient's family,
- Continue gathering feedback and data that would be necessary to determine the effectiveness of the tool.
