

Student Waiver of Rights under the Privacy Act and Copyright Act and Agreement to allow Exhibition of Theses

The dissertation/thesis is a scholarly work presenting the results of the candidate's research to the scholarly community. The University of San Francisco believes a candidate should make this research available to other scholars for the benefit of the author, the university and the scholarly community.

However, under the Copyright Act of 1976 (Copyright Act), an author may reserve all rights over his/her work, and thereby limit the availability of the work to others. Furthermore, under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (Privacy Act), a thesis/dissertation may be considered a protected, private academic record.

Therefore, in order to comply with Privacy and Copyright Acts, we ask that students elect one of the two options under each category below:


